Mail Ballots Sent for the November 16, 2021 City of Ocala Run-Off Election

Marion County, FL. October 7 - Today, the Marion County Supervisor of Elections mailed 9,844 domestic ballots to voters with a vote-by-mail request on record for the November 16, 2021 City of Ocala Run-Off Election. Last Friday, 222 UOCAVA ballots were delivered to military and overseas voters.

Voters are required to have a request on file to receive a vote-by-mail ballot. One request for a vote-by-mail ballot will cover all elections through the 2022 General Election. The deadline to request a vote-by-mail ballot to be mailed for the 2021 City of Ocala Run-Off Election is November 6 by 5 p.m. Requests can be made by visiting www.VoteMarion.Gov, calling 352-620-3290, or in person at the Supervisor of Elections office. Requests must be made by the voter or an immediate family member, and must include the voter's date of birth and Florida driver's license number or Florida ID card number, or last four digits of social security number.

Voters are reminded to verify their mailing address is current. The United States Postal Service cannot forward vote-by-mail ballots. A request for a ballot to be mailed to an address other than the voter's address on file must be in writing and signed by the voter including the voter's Florida driver license number or Florida ID card number or the last four digits of their social security number.

Vote-by-mail ballots must be signed and received by the Supervisor of Elections by 7 p.m. Election Day to be counted. The USPS encourages voters to mail their ballot early to ensure timely receipt, at least a week prior to Election Day. Due to SB 90, the 24/7 drop box located outside of the Supervisor of Elections office has been removed. However, voters may continue to utilize the secure mail ballot drop box located inside the elections office during business hours, M-F 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Voters can check their mail ballot status on the Supervisor of Elections website www.VoteMarion.Gov and are encouraged to sign up for email, SMS (text), or voice call alerts at www.MarionBallotTrax.com.
